RPRA Status: Update on our Efforts

Following the March meeting in Idaho Springs with Doug Young from Senator Udall's

office we didn't receive any of the expected follow up reports. Steve Green, a member of RPRA and also a member of COHVCO (Colorado Off Highway Vehicle Coalition), committed himself to running an email campaign with Senator Udall's office and the Regional Forest Service supervisor, Rick Cable in order to find some resolution to the Spring meeting. Both the organizations have been struggling to get the final word on ownership of the Rollins Pass Road. Many dates were established as to when the organizations (RPRA and COHVCO) would receive an answer. The target dates came and passed with no response from the officials. Finally, on advice from Counsel, we asked Gilpin and Grand County to file paperwork with the Forest Service to obtain the requested answers.

Your Board of Directors and COHVCO wrote letters to set dates for meetings with Gilpin and Grand County Commissioners. Representatives of both organizations met with Gilpin Commissioners in Central City on Oct. 26th and with Grand County in Hot Sulphur Springs on November 2nd. Both Counties, as in the past, were anxious to get the Rollins Pass Road open. Grand County Commissioners will work with the other 6 Commissioners from Gilpin and Boulder Counties to present paperwork to the Forest Service to reopening the road. You will be kept informed of progress. We appreciate your support for our goal and are looking forward to getting the paperwork in action now so our Dream can come true!

Many thanks to Steve Green for his spring fund raising efforts and a generous contribution to the Rollins Pass Restoration Association.

Rollins Pass Restoration Association member, Jim Yust, is spearheading the restoration of Denver & Rio Grande Western Spreader 044 (91,000#) which is now located at the Grand County Historical Society Museum in Hot Sulphur Springs. The 'Spreader' had a snow plow blade on the front and pushed with a locomotive engine from the rear. Spreader 044 was a homemade construction in the Rio Grande Western's Burnham Shops, in Denver during 1918 from a former Rio Grande Western flatcar that was built in 1901. Only three of the Spreaders were built and the one in Hot Sulphur Springs is the only one remaining. It spent most of its operating life based in Helper, Utah, but made many trips over the Moffat Road for service in Denver. Hot Sulphur Springs is a great day trip and seeing the museum and the Spreader.
